WHAT ARE THE DANGERS?

CYBER BULLYING

What is it?

Hurtful/unkind comments or images designed to cause discomfort or distress. This can include 'liking' comments posted by others.



ONLINE SECURITY

What is it?

Unlawful access to private data or information. This could include anything from schoolwork to bank details. This is mostly due to people being careless or having ineffective security. It can include malicious hacking, phishing or scamming.



CHILD EXPLOITATION

What is it?

Children being tricked into performing sexual activities, often in return for gifts, money or affection. When a person builds a connection or trust over a period of time, this is called grooming.



HOW DO I STAY SAFE?

SECURE DEVICES

- Lock all your devices having strong passwords
- Change passwords regularly
- Never share logon or password details



STRANGER DANGER

Never agree to meet or 'friend' someone you do not know
