#### **Attendance**

The impact on student success when attendance falls is dramatic, nationally if a student misses on average one day of school per fortnight then the chances of achieving GCSE English and Maths at grades 9-4 falls from 83.7% to 35.6%. Also from a safeguarding perspective knowing your child is safe in school is of utmost importance. If your child is too unwell to be in school please ensure that you call our attendance line on 01935 446885 or email attendance@westfieldacademy.co.uk before 830am on the morning of absence. Please ensure you contact school every day your child is absent.

If you are unsure if your child is too unwell for school, please do send them to school and rest assured we will contact home if we need to during the day.

If you have not contacted the school about an absence you will receive an email, phone call or home visit. We will only authorise absence other than for illness in exceptional circumstances. Please request an absence form from the attendance officer, Mr Johnson if necessary.

#### Road Safety

As you can imagine, the school gates are very busy places at the start and the end of the school day.

Conditions are worsened with the dark and gloomy weather conditions at this time of year.

Please remind your child/ren of safety tips (highway code) when crossing the road; wearing of fluorescence clothing for younger children, wearing headphones/airpods not only prevent them hearing traffic approaching but also ensures their focus is not on road safety & being mindful of other pedestrians using the pavements, etc.



Please do not drop your children off outside of the school on the zig zag yellow lines, these are designed to ensure that school entrances are kept clear of hazards and traffic. Parking in this area compromises our students' safety.
