New Principal

Westfield Academy is delighted to announce the appointment of their new Principal from September 2018. In December, Mr Chris Hunt announced his intention to retire from his role as Principal of Westfield Academy. Mr Hunt has made an outstanding difference to the school in his time as Principal and the school is much changed. As well as an improvement in results and an Ofsted rating of Good, the school has undergone a radical improvement in its facilities. Westfield now boasts two sports halls, an outstanding outdoor courts area, a new 4G sports pitch, new dance studio, a new theatre, an outstanding music department with recording studios, and most recently, a new Design and Technology block. Westfield Academy now has a strong reputation across the community resulting in the incoming year group being fully subscribed. With this in mind, it was essential that we were able to appoint a new Principal who would be able to build on this excellent progress and enable the school to make the step up to outstanding. Therefore, we are delighted to announce that we have appointed Mr Simon Dallimore as the new Principal from September. Mr Dallimore was appointed from a strong field comprising existing heads and deputies from across the country. In his role as Vice Principal, Mr Dallimore has been part of the transformation of the school over these recent years and understands the role of Westfield in the community.
